

What we achieved







Community Education:

Events organised: 8

No. of people at events: 509

No. of children participated: 231

Landfill Reduction:

Increase in recycling: 74.64 tonnes

Food waste reduction: 0.226 tonnes

CO2e Reduction:

61.08 tonnes

What's next?

Trial options for reducing food waste going to landfill

- Food waste collection trail
- More food waste composters for businesses, schools and householders
- Pilot community fridge
- Food waste reduction and low carbon food events

Provide recycling facilities where there aren't any currently

- 'Mobile' recycling kit for events
- 'Recycling on the Go' stations
- Beach Clean stations



What's next?

Work with hospitality businesses to promote lower carbon alternatives and increase recycling

- A new low carbon Eco-Charter for businesses
- Business trials of lower carbon alternatives to replace plastics e.g. take away boxes, cups, cutlery
- Further promote the business recycling services

Run workshops to equip residents with skills in repair and reuse

- Clothes and textiles
- Computer and electrical equipment
- Furniture repair and reuse workshops
- Bicycle repair workshops



What's next?

Increase carbon literacy

- Carbon literacy 'roadshow' at local events
- Carbon 'masterclass' in schools
- Carbon Conversations' workshops for people with a keen interest in reducing their carbon emissions
